Spring 2011 ECLSTS Roundtable Discussion

The following is excerpted from Lewis Polk's presentation at the East Coast Large Scale Train Show (ECLSTS) in York, PA on March 25th and 26th of this year. Lewis was inspired by the late Robert F. Kennedy in his lust for creativity in the world of large scale model trains.

That's why I'm glad I was here for the beginning days of this great G Gauge train hobby. I attended the Nuremberg, Germany Toy Fair in 1968 and saw

the very first LGB train early on the first morning and soon after we were the National Reps for REA selling LGB in America. I've been a G Gauger since 1968 and I'm probably the oldest G Gauge hobbyist in America.

That's why we made the first pulse width train controller that used computerization instead of the 100-year-old copper wind concept. Now all DCC is PWC along with our power supplies and Revo system.

That's why we made a grade of track with more copper and at half the price of the other brands. We wanted you to see the difference when you moved from one brand of track to ours and see the pickup of speed.

That's why we made standard gauge 1.29th scale, when everyone else made narrow gauge that was 10% of the total sales in other scales. This was the traditional scale for most trains in the early 1900's

up until WWII and we wanted a traditional American scale, not a European meter gauge train. Three times up from 1/87 scale is 1/29 scale, so it's easier for scratch builders to scale up and for us to scale up from the smaller scale.

That's why we made the FA-1 loco that was our best seller of all times. We sold 20,000 the first year and confirmed G as a legitimate scale in the U.S. for American trains.

That's why we made radio control for model trains. It's crazy to run back 100' or more to your power supply to see if the train was correctly put on the track again.

There are those who look at things the way they are, and ask why... I dream of things that never were, and ask why not? –ROBERT KENNEDY

That's why we made the Revolution in 2.4 Ghz to allow the signal to be out of the noise range of motors. We have long experience in the model car, airplane and ship fields and 2.4 Ghz is the dominating frequency in these markets. We had the ability to bring it to the model train field along with battery operation of trains.

That's why we made our universal gearbox that we patented and every train did not have to go through exhaustive testing each time.

That's why we made Live Steam locos using plastic bodies. No one

thought we could do it, but today's ABS plastic is an engineering plastic and you can select a high temp version.

That's why we made ready built structures. The trick was not in the assembly using China's assembly power, but in making a fool proof-shipping package that could make it across the seas and through express shipping here.

That's why we made our own figures. We wanted figures with personalities and could only get what we wanted by sculpting them ourselves.

That's why we made so many track radius curves, which doubled the flexibility of layout possibilities. The larger sizes of 10, 11.5, 16.5 and 20' allowed for much larger trains to be run and we were not restricted to a 4' rule.

That's why we made our wide radius switches and many thousands have been sold. The #6 and Wye switches brought a reality-sized layout capability to G Gauge.

That's why we made our low cost slow motion switch machine, which is much more realistic than a snap switch and is a huge seller for us.

That's why we made our 20' cars, so that smaller layouts can be built. We didn't want to leave the early pioneers in G out in the cold and gave them a shorty 20' car option.

That's why we made our Stainless Steel track, which eliminated the oxidation of brass track problem.

That's why we made our Aluminum Track, so that battery and steam trains could be run at a lower overall cost.

That's why we made an inline re-railer, which is still the only way to bring trucks back on to the track while the train is running and a great way to mount trains by using two or three rerailers at the point of loading. No one else has done this and yet it's still the best way to keep trains on the track even when it's derailed by "droppings" from nature.

That's why we made Lithium Ion packs with its own safety cutoff board and an auto shutoff charger. We have an auto-cutoff charger for these batteries, so that.

That's why we're making a combine board with motor control and sound, so there are absolutely no wires or soldering needed.

That's why we're making an auto charge board for batteries for 24-7-365 battery charging if you have track power available.

That's why we made a "tongue in cheek" EGGLINER and we continue

to add to the collectability of it with a constant program of new imaginative releases. Who doesn't like an Egg. for those that scoffed; wouldn't they like to have a dollar for each one we sold?

That's why we made a metal polished aluminum RDC and streamline passenger cars, which are most complicated to make with such a finish.

That's why we made the PCC trolley for the Interurban market.

That's why we made an auto cut-off patented smoke unit.

That's why we made both Euro and American tie track roadbeds. Why run American trains on a European style track?

That's why we made a track-cleaning car with a rubber-cleaning pad. It works and is inexpensive.

That's why we were the first G Gauge Company with a public Forum. It's still the friendliest board out there and we still enforce the no "handle" rule, so you know whom you're talking to.

That's why we're going to make and all plastic roadbed track for battery and steam operation at a super low cost. This will be an ABS plus fiber glass material with an integrated roadbed in U.V. material and colored a dark gray. ABS is an engineering plastic and we will have a wide variation of temperature capability for this material.

As a matching and necessary component we will make a low cost 2.4Ghz, radio to use with low cost batteries to run on this new plastic track. Once you're comfortable with r/c and battery operation you can skill up to our Revolution and run multi trains on the same track.

That's why we have an interactive Internet store where you can see what's on order and what we're making. It's part of our accounting software and we make an order it's shown immediately along with the expected date of delivery.

The best is yet to come, as we will not let the status quo remain. "We're as good as any and better than most."

We're working on your railroad and we listen to your input and incorporate your ideas into the product line. Should you have any suggestions, by all means, please e-mail: lewis@polkshobby.com ♦

The Making of the PCC Trolley by Aristo-Craft Trains

We long wanted to make this model, but there were many variations of the model, so we decided to make the original version as designed by the President's Convention Committee. This was a joint committee of all the President's of the various trolley companies in America, who decided to make a common car they could all use sharing in the development costs. We were able to obtain an engineering document that they all used to make their trolleys, but drawings are only two dimensional. Fortunately, there was a trolley museum that had a recently restored version in their barn and we got permission to visit and take photos.

John Mikesh, our product manager, took a drive up there and took several hundred photos of the trolley including the interior. There were many photos on the Internet, but none of the interior. We wanted to make a detailed interior, so the ability to shoot pictures of this part of the trolley was important for us.

The fact that we had an accurate interior also led to our decision to put 20 hi-bright white LED's in the interior to better show off the

interior. We were insistent that you could see the interior in daylight as well as at night time. We also knew that you would populate the interior with figures and we wanted to allow the figures to be seen readily and the extra white LED's was integral to show off these details. By the way, we have both seated and standing figures from our RMT line of O Gauge that happen to look appropriate inside this model. You can find them at www.readymadetoys.com and order them there or from an Aristo dealer that stocks this item. We will retest the lighting with warm orange LED's and make a final decision soon if they provide sufficient lighting to let you see the interior during the day. While perhaps more prototypical, we want you to see the results of our efforts and we will make the final determination soon.

So...we had the drawings done and were cutting steel to make the molds...and the factory, Sanda Kan, went bankrupt. Not only were we not sure that we could obtain our molds, but whether or not we had a factory to make the product or not.

We were fortunate that after a short while a new company

purchased the factory and started re-building it and a stock of raw materials. When we finally got a working sample we noticed that on curves the wheels would hit the die-cast chassis and cause it to short. We had to rebuild the chassis to put wheel wells in to allow the trolley to make tight curves and not touch the metal chassis. Now we found we had to put in channels for the wires, so that if the wire's coating wore off they would not touch the chassis either. However, it took a Teflon tube to make sure that the coating was protected at the points that the wire swiveled along with the movement of the power truck.

We also used a special chip to program the brake light coming on when the engine slowed, but the factory did not have the proper coding machine to mass program these chips and we needed to send our programmer machine to them to get the job done. Of course, they thought that we had not written a proper code, as they could not get it to work until we sent them our programmer. This was quite exasperating, as each

side was blaming each other until we sent them sample chips already programmed. These things happen when you're working 8,000 miles away from each other, but how do you explain such delays to an eagerly awaiting public longing for a faster delivery.

This was a brand new gear-box, so we had to test run it for several hundred hours to insure it's durability. It worked perfectly here and we will be using a similar version to make an SW-1 loco later in the year. In both cases the chassis is so low to the track that we had to design a new gear box that would allow the low height and had to find a motor to allow for the in-line operation within the power truck. With the detailed interior there was no room to allow for a vertical motor instead of our preferred horizontal motor directly in line with the power brick. We also needed the die-cast chassis with $3\frac{1}{2}$ pounds of weight as there was no room to allow for additional weight inside the trolley car's body as we normally do on regular locos.

Another challenge was to find a shorter sized pin for our port to accept our Revolution board. They just don't make them in China and

we needed to scour American pin makers to find the correct ones. This search held off the starting time for production as they can't begin purchasing other parts until they had a source for all parts to be used in production.



Then we needed to do the artwork for the dozen or so paint schemes to be made in the first run. We didn't have any books with detailed artwork to copy and had to search the Internet for renditions of the version we were going to do. Each company varied the paint schemes regularly and there were no definitive source to obtain accurate paint schemes. It took several times our normal allotted time to finish each of these. Of course the factory was not pressuring us for completion, so they can order the parts for production.

We knew that this item was going to be a blockbuster, so we remained patient through all these trials and




tribulations. You can imagine the tension until we received a working sample and then paint samples for us to approve.

It was quite a learning experience and we're now making 10 more paint schemes and will re-run some of the older ones with each production of new schemes over the next few runs. We will do at least 50 schemes scheduled and then go back to add extra paint schemes from some of the larger user cities. We will do smaller cities too and some foreign versions that used PCC's too.

Every step of the way was a challenge, but the results were worth the extraordinary effort. We will make a "standee window" version in two years and then move on to some other trolleys as well.

We hope you enjoy them both as a mantle piece and as a good running item on your layout. ♦





Spotlight On the Aristo-Craft In-Line Re-Railer

This product is a most under looked one as it allows a wheel that has come off the track to be boosted back onto the rail magically. There are times when your train will de-rail for seemingly no reason, but usually there are some environmental issues dropping on to the track. This can be a tree leaf or branch or as simple as a snail crawling over the rail at the wrong moment. As much as you work at keeping the track clean things happen and a wheel is forced off the track.

Another reason trains de-rail are complicated "S" curves that pull the wheels in odd directions and thus a derailment. The Aristo-Craft re-railer fixes that problem automatically without any intervention by you, the hobbyist. Many times you will not even know it's a problem, but invariably our unit detects the problem and cures it.

The solution is the in-line re-railer (ART 11350), which will push the wheel up a small ramp and back on to the track. As simple as

it sounds, we had to spend a few months getting that ramp angle exactly correct through a trial and error process. This was done when we had no CAD drawing capability and we had to scratch build all samples by hand. Imagine the number of samples we had to make before getting a proven device that will work all the time.

Additionally, it has a major use as a loading point for your trains. All you have to do is move your trains back and forth over the re-railer and all your locos and cars will quickly align themselves on the track ready to be coupled to the next one you similarly insert. We recommend you use two or three together to allow for longer locos and cars to be placed easily on the track and its performance is certitude.

This re-railer comes in 12" (30cm) lengths to conform to most track layouts and can replace normal lengths in use. It's easy and can use the same rail joiners or rail clamps you always use.

It's a "Duh" device and once you use it you will wonder why you didn't think of it yourself. Don't worry!

Aristo-Craft did it for you. ♦

The Aristo-Craft Railroad Club: A Bit of History

Eighteen years ago, ARISTO-CRAFT TRAINS put flyers in some of their rolling stock produced that year. I believe it was printed in *Garden Railways Magazine* announcing the starting of a club for us Aristo-Nauts. It was called the “Aristo-Craft Railroad Club.”

According to the membership application, they began receiving applications around May 1, 1993. The annual membership fee was \$50.00 which INCLUDED a triple dome tank car. This was not just any triple dome tank car from the roster in 1994 but a specially designed triple domed tank car JUST for CLUB MEMBERS.



It had a black body with red domes and ends. The lettering said

Aristo-Craft Trains Railroad Club and underneath the letter were the words *Jersey City, New Jersey*. The road number was ARCX #41694. The car had a little gold box in the upper left-hand corner of the tank body that said *Aristo-Craft Trains Railroad Club Special Edition Series-1994*. These cars came with printed signatures of Nathan Polk on one side and Irwin S. Polk on the other side in gold paint.



The application blank stated that the delivery will begin AFTER January 1, 1994. So, 17 years ago, the first Aristo-Craft Railroad Club Car rolled off the assembly lines. With

the membership came a Newsletter with “inside” information on ARISTO-CRAFT TRAINS as well as new catalogs and flyers, when available. This newsletter was the precursor of today’s popular *INSIDER* Newsletter—Aristo-Craft’s premiere newsletter published bimonthly specifically for its membership.

Members also would receive a “special numbers membership card, with a specific number assigned only to you.” Each year you would also received a membership certificate that had your name and membership number printed on it. It was actually hand-signed by Lewis Polk—typical of Lewis’ attention to detail and personal value he attached to all of his Aristo-Nauts. This certificate was suitable for framing.

Many of the first couple years each of the ‘club cars’ came with an individual serial number written on the outside of the shipping box.

This club car is a prized piece of ARISTO-CRAFT TRAINS for me. You do not see many of the early club cars for sale. —Harry Hartman ♦




RCC Remote 2.4 GHZ Switch Device

For many years, I was perfectly happy operating 6 of the 12 switches on PCSRR using the “air controller” method. The other 6 were well within reach to be operated manually. Years prior to the air controlled method, most of my switches were controlled with electric 1201 LGB* motors using 12 volt battery power with DPDT momentary center off switches or just thrown manually.

Just over a year ago, Lewis invited me to test the new CREST Aristo-Craft REVOLUTION Remote Switch Device (RSD). Upon receiving the RSD, I opened the



package, even carefully read the instructions, hooked it up to one of the 1201 LGB* motors and powered the RSD with a 12 volt battery to bench test it. Following the very easy to understand “programming and linking” instructions, I pushed the left and right arrows on the key pad to see the switch change direction and hear the resounding “click.” It worked very nicely at a distance of 4 feet with each push. Then it was time to see how far I could be from the RSD and still have it work. Distances up to 80 feet were tested and with each key push the switch changed direction.

I was very satisfied with the test performance and started making provision to convert a few of the switches on the layout. Because I had a whole grocery sack full of new LGB* 1201 switch motors, I proceeded to install and test them. Input power was changed from

the 12 volt gel cell battery to 16 volts DC supplied from an old DC “transformer.” This way I could turn the device(s) on and off at will.


Our layout has a number of crossovers from one track to another which requires 2 switches to be thrown at the same time. The next project was to see if two of the LGB* 1201 switch motors could be operated on just one of the output terminal blocks. Two motors were hooked to the same output terminal and tested. They worked just like I had hoped which meant I could use all 5 output terminals and use as many as 10

switches on a single device.

Because only one terminal will operate at one time, the RSD is protected from an overload. It was very simple to hook up 2 motors by running one main wire to one and using a short

section of wire from one motor to the other and making sure the polarity is correct to throw the switches the right way when activated.

The wiring used on the first RSD was some multiple-pair, 16-gauge surplus TV antenna rotor cable that I had “saved” for some future use. It was weatherproof and color coded for ease of identification. When that cable was gone, I used 4 pair of color-coded, weatherproof telephone cable. It worked just fine. Seven motors were connected to the first



RSD with 2 terminals controlling 2 switches each and 3 with one each.

With the first RSD in service, the air operated system was removed from the layout and sold. The more we used the first RSD, the easier it became to operate the railroad. As stated above, the layout had 12 remotely operated switches and now that 7 of them are operated by the REVOLUTION RSD, I am ready to convert the other 5. The sale of the air equipment allowed the purchase of the second RSD. When it arrived, it was connected to the remaining 5 switches. 4 of these were connected to operate as pairs from 2 output terminals and the single one to a 3rd output leaving 2 open for expansion.

Because we do not use track power, it was my choice to install both the RSDs in the train shed, power them with the 16 volt DC output from a power supply and run the wiring from the shed under the track, under landscaping, alongside bridges and trestles or any other way to get the wires to the motors to be able to operate them.

The manual for the REVOLUTION Remote Switch Device is very complete in its description for installation and programming procedures, so I haven’t covered those items in this article other than sharing that each of the RSD output terminals has 2 settings – one “FAST” and one “SLOW.” The LGB* 1201 motors require the FAST setting. The complete manual is available as a Word.doc for viewing on the Aristo-Craft website under *Technical Support, Train Engineer Revolution, and Remote Switch Device*.

Using two RSD’s, I have full remote control of 12 switches from anywhere on the layout using the REVOLUTION transmitter(s). *The running of the Prescott Canyon Southern Garden Railroad has been REVOLUTION-ized.* ♦

EXHIBITIONS

What goes into a typical show exhibition...



We've attended perhaps 1,000 train show exhibitions over the past 40+ years and each one is an adventure for us as an exhibitor. First, we have to decide the nature of the show as far as attendee types that will be visiting our booth. Then we have to analyze the costs of the show and the message we want to express at the show. Is there travel involved? Do we have to ship the booth and merchandise a long distance? How many people do we need in the booth? And do we have to feed and house them at the show in addition to paying overtime for the weekend shows? What is the time of year and how do we select what we're showing in relation to the season? How much time does it take to set up and when do we have to arrive at the show along with our merchandise?

We then diagram the booth setup and decide where everything will go in advance. Lighting, signs, drapery

and electrical functionality are decided in advance too—but it's the birth of a new product that drives the interest and sales. It takes years to bring a new product to market and we are most proud when we get to show it to everyone for the first time. Our PCC Trolley was 3-4 years in the making and when we did show it, they sold out the first run in 3 weeks. Obviously, we have many more paint schemes in the works and many more to come after that.

All these factors come down to a budget and how much manpower can we devote to a particular show. Then we divide the targeted costs into the number of people usually at a particular show or judge the quality of visitors in relation to our product. We're a business that needs to justify our expenses in relation to sales. You can only do so much prospecting without an expected return on investment. Aristo-Craft attends a show per month on average and most of them have 20,000 people or more. We've listed them on our website and in general, we cover a great deal of the major population centers.

Typically, we try to highlight newer product, but frankly we want to attract new customers too, where our entire product line is new to them. We try to have plenty of literature and neat displays with a lot to look at along with some trains running to show the quality of our product line.

We are mostly dealing with consumers, not trade customers, though many other exhibitors are also customers. Therefore, the booth has to appeal to both markets and to be as self-explanatory as possible.

It's the job of the attendees to carefully review each booth and ask intelligent questions about the product that was so painstakingly set up and displayed at a great cost by the vendor. It's always great to hear someone thank us for attending and asking really smart questions about our mostly technical products.

So...when you visit a booth at a show, please give it more than a cursory glance and try to catch the message the hardworking exhibitor is trying to pass on to you.


