Gary Raymond's two outdoor modular layouts in 1/32 scale will be open on Sunday, September 9, from 10:00 to 5:00. The address is 2406 Sirius Street, Thousand Oaks.

Gary has two #1 scale modular layouts. One was featured in an article in OUTDOOR RAILROADER Magazine titled "Reinventing the Module". A three-foot narrow gauge section was added (1n3 = 1.125" gauge) with expansion plans modeling Southern Pacific narrow gauge. That layout was used at train conventions from 1996 through 2000.

In 2005 Gary decided to rebuild this layout with smaller curves and create a dedicated layout that would not have to be disassembled and moved in and out of his back yard. It is big enough to give a sense of what is possible in #1 Scale but small enough to fit into any train show. The Radii are 5.5 feet which accommodates all but the largest brass engines. This layout has been on display at the Southwest Garden Railroad Show, Big Train Show, and NMRA Train Shows since 2005.

The original 1:32 modular layout now lives permanently in the backyard and is used for testing and running. It retains the original operating highway and has two 32 foot passing sidings and one short spur. Neither of the layouts use track power. Both layouts require engines with onboard batteries and radio control. All equipment wheel sets conform to the NMRA and G1MRA back to back semi-scale standard of 1.575 inches (40 mm).

This open house is part of a larger tour of ten railroads that same day sponsored by Model Railroads Of Southern California. The group's thirty-fifth layout tour will be a self-guided tour of ten layouts at ten locations in an area running just south of Santa Barbara down through Ventura County and into northwest Los Angeles County. Four layouts are appearing for the first time on our tour program: Richard Conner's HO scale Boston & Maine, James Donlon's HO scale SP Coastline, Tom Fratello's HO scale Siskiyou Line and Bruce Smale's S scale layout. Altogether there will be eight HO scale layouts, one large scale layouts and one S scale layout. This is a free event and you may bring relatives and friends. Here are the layouts and schedules:
