

Open-house holiday railroad tours are on track

Members of the Arizona Big Train Operators group have been working on their railroads in preparation for their annual Christmas Open House Tours.

Members will open their homes to the public this weekend and the next to show off their garden railroad layouts and raise money for Cardon Children's Medical Center and Phoenix Children's Hospital. The home tours are from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. Saturday and Sunday and Dec. 17 and 18.

Donations last year totaled more than \$5,000.

Rich Hull of Sun Lakes has spent the better part of the past month getting his model railroad layout ready for public viewing.

"I've been working about three solid weeks now," Hull said. "It's quite extensive. The trains are quite temperamental with the weather we've been having. For a anybody to get a layout presentable to the public, it takes quite a while."

The Hulls have been participating in the home tours for the past six years. He said the challenge is keeping things fresh for repeat visitors.

"We've had little kids come out who have been here the past two or three years," Hull said. "They recognize when you change things up. We try to have two or three little things different that they can look for or do things like have them look for the Santa Clauses. We have kids who will follow a train around the entire layout."

The group gets its name because members run model trains about 1/25th the size of real trains on G gauge tracks that are about 1.8 inches (45 millimeters) wide. The trains and tracks are bigger than the typical model trains that many enthusiasts start with as children.

The bigger trains require more space to put together a realistic looking layout, which makes them more conducive to operating outdoors. Some club members have layouts that include bridges, trestles, other vehicles and water features as well as more elaborate touches.

Hull's layout includes a model refinery that burns liquid propane gas.

Fifteen members of the club are opening their homes for the tours although not all members will be available both weekends. The layout at Cardon Children's Medical Center will also be part of the tour.

"This is the 13th year we've done it," member
