Bob and Maryann Brenneman of North Codorus Township remembered bringing their kids to see the display when they sold tickets through the 4-H club. This year, they came with their daughter, Barb, 40, and her son, Joshua.

"I like Thomas the Train," the excited 4-year-old explained, alluding to the Susquehanna Valley Garden Railroad Society's train garden in one of the pavilions. "He goes 'round the track."

Parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles shepherded their little ones from one display to another. One grandparent seized the opportunity to p ractice colors, pointing to different light bulbs as the toddler quietly whispered, "red," "green," "orange."

Santa Claus, aka Mike Ulrich, 48, of York, even stopped by. It was this Santa's first time there.
